Overview, from the *directors*...

Elections are a funny business. As soon as you think you've seen everything, something completely unexpected happens. That was how it was on the night of April 7th, after the last votes had been tallied in the municipal elections. An old maxim in this line of work is that write-in candidacies are doomed to failure from the start — being more closely akin to tilting at windmills than posing a real threat to someone who has gone to the trouble of actually filing for office.

But in the citywide election for councilman-at-large in Berkeley and the race for alderman in Ward 3 of Frontenac, candidates who had missed the filing deadline ignored the odds and mounted successful campaigns to win out over incumbent office holders. According to old sages at the Election Board, this was the first instance of a successful write-in effort since the 1970s. And it happened not just once, but twice in the same day!

With the April election behind us, our attention turned to the August primary and the general election in November. Back in 1994 the legislature ordered the secretary of state to implement a statewide data base of registered voters by 1996. This provided a means of cleaning up our voter rolls by checking for duplicate registrations with other Missouri counties. As the April election wound down, we received the first shipment from Jefferson City of what would eventually be 26,500 names to research.

The computer age made this list a practical-

ity, but checking the registration records came down to old fashioned sleuthing on the part of our staff.

The expression "vote early and vote often" comes to mind when we hear about duplicate registrations. The truth is that as voters move from one county to another, they neglect to cancel their old registration before adding their names to the rolls in their new county.

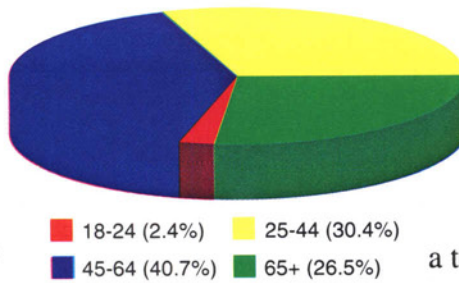
So we parceled the names out to our staff to begin a tedious hand check against our computer files. Any activity in St. Louis County later than the registration date in the other jurisdiction was deemed to be a St. Louis County voter in good standing. On the other hand, if the file showed a registration date *after* ours, that person was deleted. In the end, 11,738 names were removed from our records, giving us 603,022 registered voters for the general election. Even though that figure put us more than 26,000 voters under the count for the same election two years ago, we're confident it reflects a much cleaner and more accurate data base.

While the next general election is more than a year and a half away, the state legislature has scheduled a presidential primary, to be held concurrent with our April municipal elections, in the year 2000. This will only be the second presidential primary ever held in Missouri, the first being in 1988. It looks as though the primary will be a quadrennial, permanent replacement for the caucus in this state as the way for Missourians to have a say in picking the candidates for our country's highest office.

The timing of future primaries, beyond the year 2000, could still be affected by forces at the national level. The thinking there tends toward grouping geographical areas of the U.S. to make up blocs of regional "Super Tuesdays." At this time the only certainty is that any presidential primary would precede by a number of months our regular biennial August primary election.

One of the main problems plaguing all election administrators, including this office, is low voter turnout. Although interest in public affairs and a desire to participate more actively in the election process picks up as people get older, the fact remains that a high percentage of our 18-24 year old voters lack even a casual interest in government or simply don't connect with the political process. Their participation rate of 2.4% in the general election was considerably less than half their 5.7% turnout two years ago.

There is a national initiative in place that over time could have an impact in turning this age group around. **KIDS VOTING-USA** is a program that four of the county's twenty-four school districts participated in during the November election. The curriculum is made up of activities designed to develop information gathering skills that aid in critical decision making. The study of democracy and citizenship concludes with students casting their votes alongside their parents on election day.

Since this is the information age, we knew we couldn't hold the attention of the younger people of St. Louis County without a strong

presence on the internet. With this goal in mind we spent the slow time between Thanksgiving and the first of the year overhauling our office's home page. What had been impressive in 1996 was definitely dated two years later. The new site (*see our home page on pg. 21*) is a "must see" for any candidate for office in St. Louis County. It features links to all five of Missouri's political parties and the legislative home pages of our congressional, general assembly and county council delegations as well as a current election calendar and over 75 political district and township maps. Another page lets you "look up" your state senate and representative district by typing in your home address.

We hope our new web site will be used as a teaching aid in civics classes throughout St. Louis County and encourage a renewed interest in government and the political process at all levels.

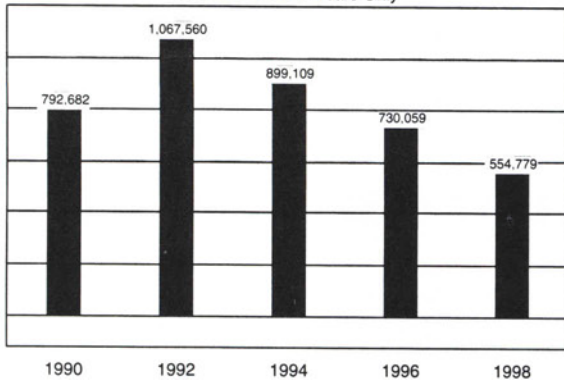

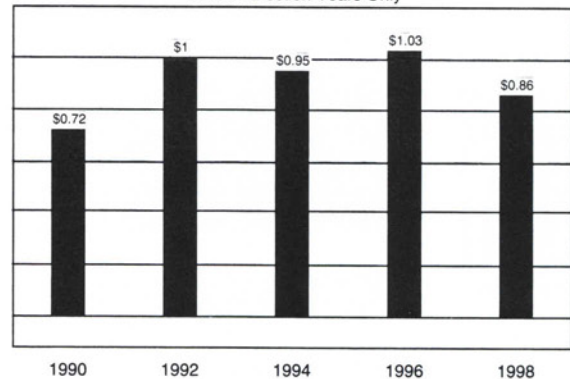

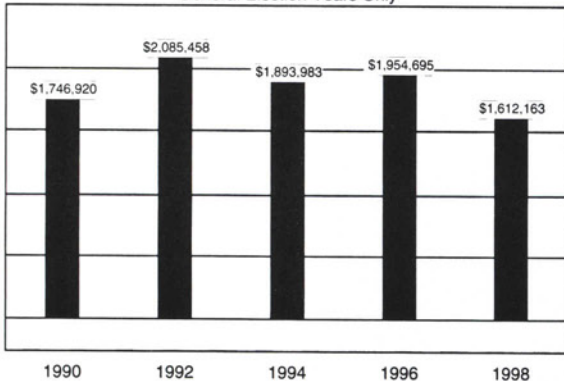
Total Ballots Cast
General Election Years Only



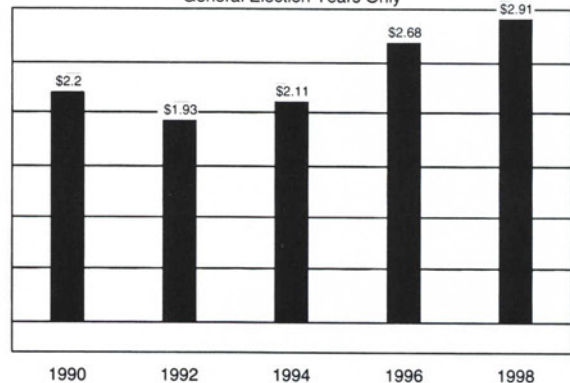
Annual Costs Per Registered Voter

General Election Years Only



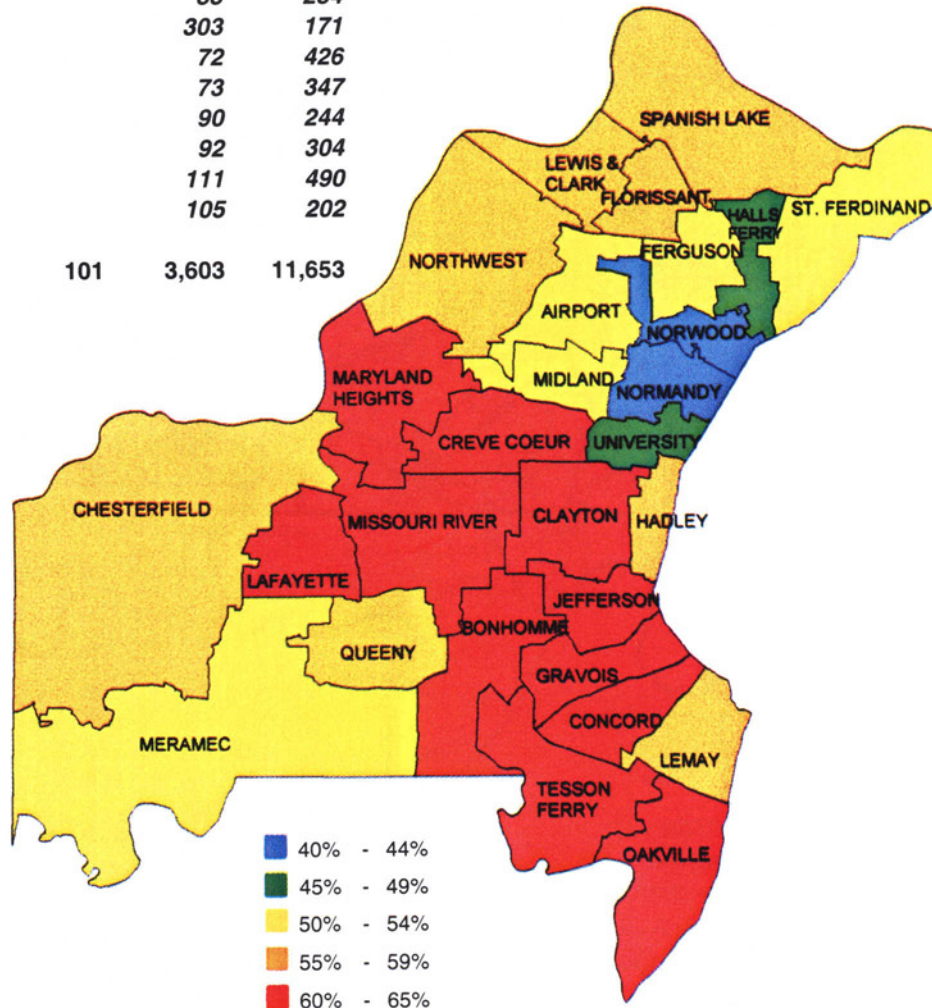
Annual Costs Per Ballot Cast
General Election Years Only



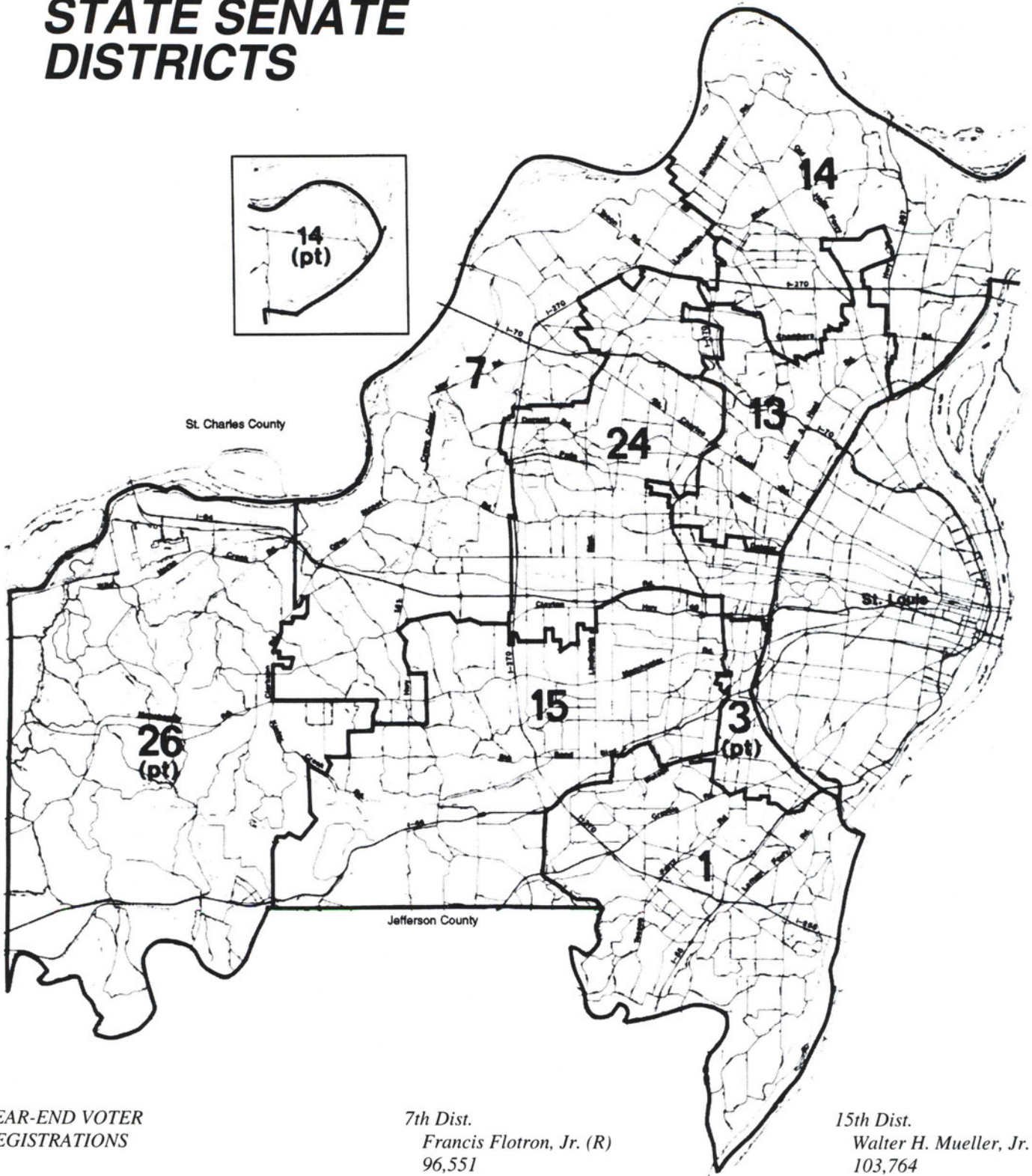

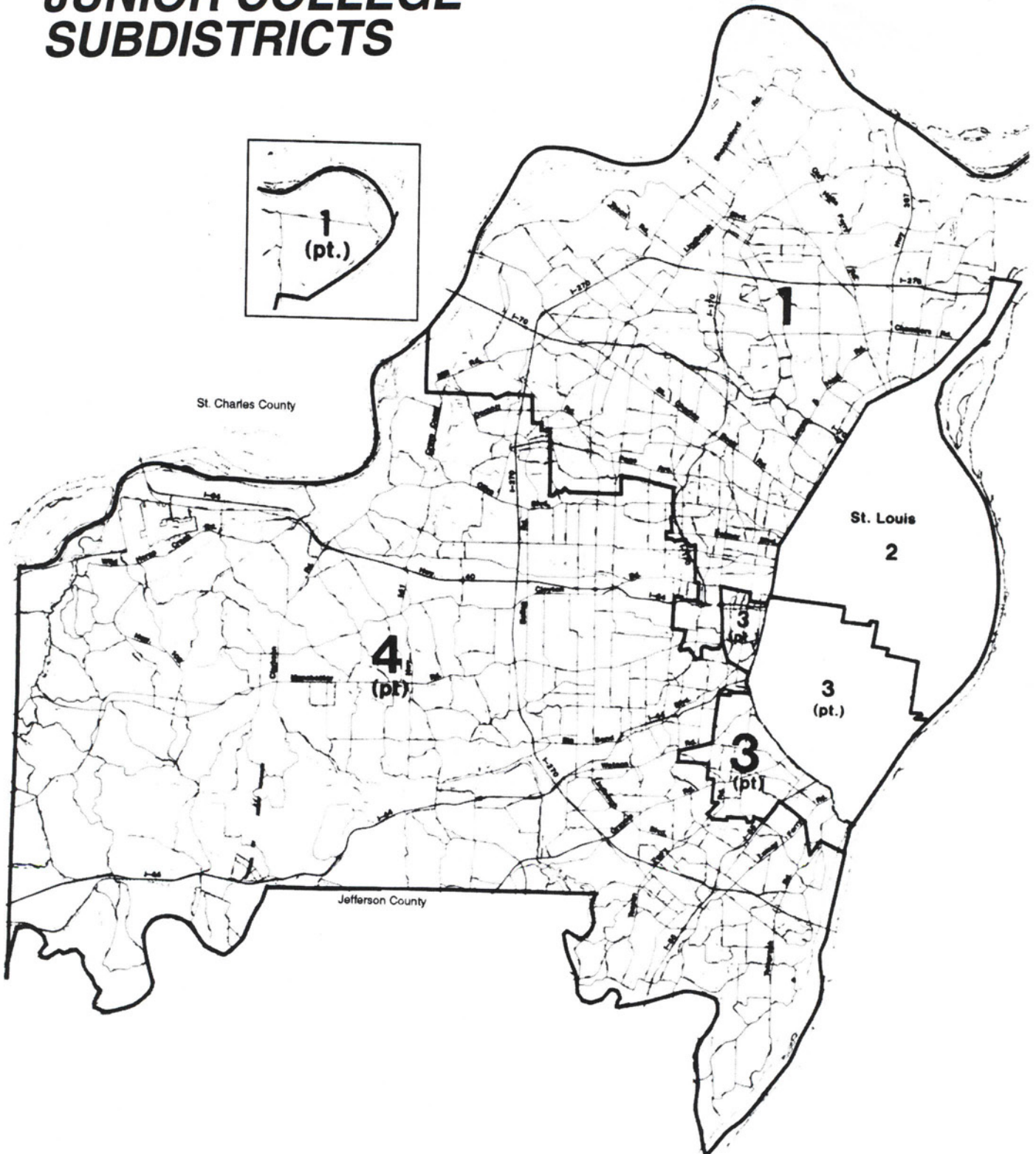

Certified results by polling place of recent and past elections, reported by office or voting entity, are posted under [election results](#) as soon as a final audit of the election is completed; usually 10-14 days after a major election. The earliest elections available on the "net" are the 1996 April municipal elections. Election results will remain posted throughout a four year presidential election cycle.

By accessing [elected officials](#) you can go to web sites of the St. Louis County Council, members of the Missouri State Legislature and the U.S. Congress in Washington, D.C., and gain e-mail access to those offices. If you don't know the name of your state senator or representative just click on [Vote Smart](#) and type in your zip code.

This interactive site is a "must" for any serious student of American government. A paper handout on the College is also available through the St. Louis County election office.

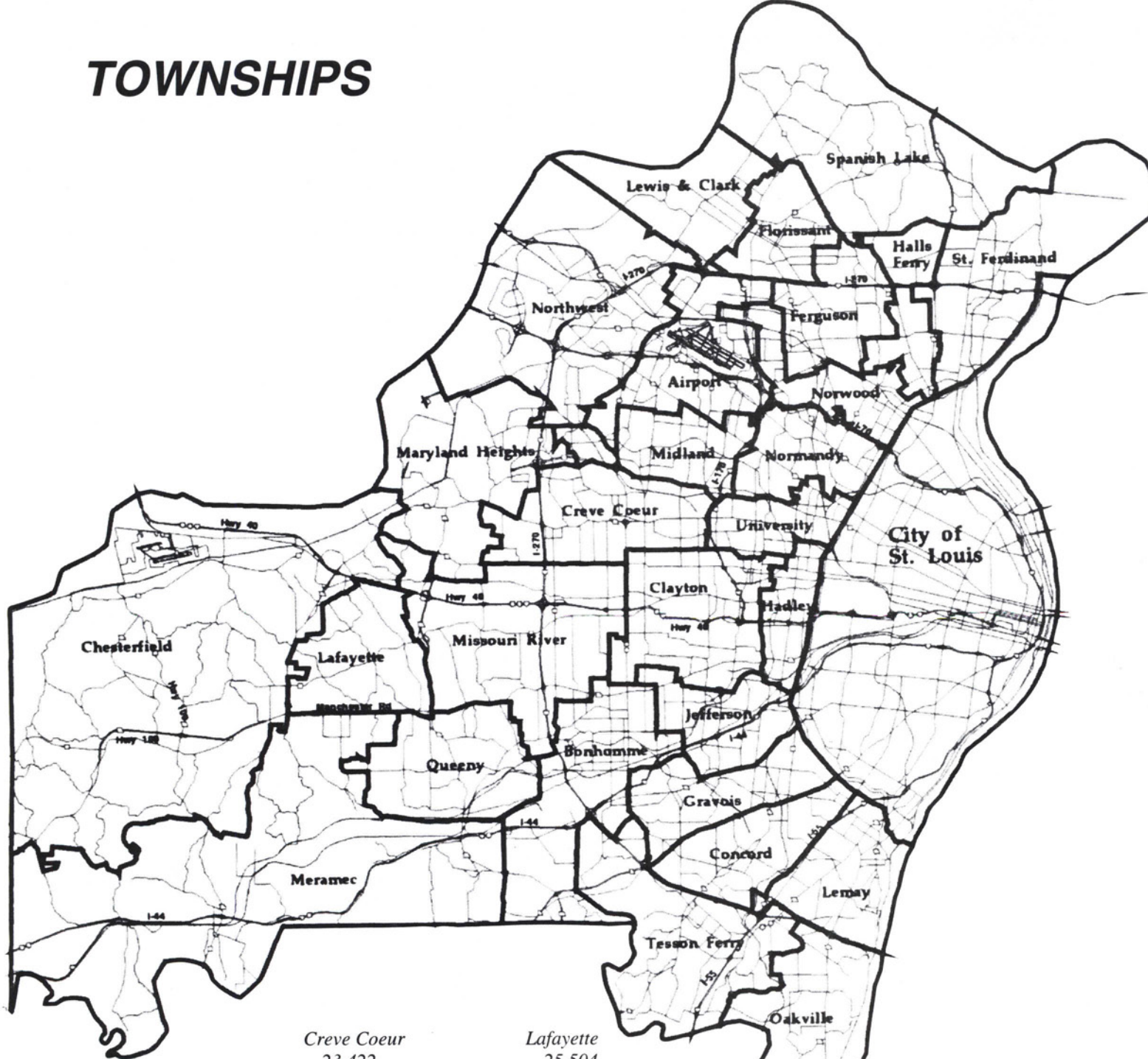
